HOUSES:

## ACCELERATED BACCALAUREATE PROGRAM:

This program allows a select group of students to compress or accelerate their degree program. Students chosen for admission into this program have recognized academic proficiencies warranting reductions in general education and elective credit requirements resulting in reduction of the university's standard 180 credit hour baccalaureate degree requirement. Accelerated Baccalaureate students must take a minimum of 135 credit hours in residence at the university. Credits earned through approved exchange programs may be counted toward this minimum. All department major requirements also must be completed in residence.
